How are you at carrying out the great commission? Many people think that's the job of their pastors in the church, teachers in our parochial schools, or missionaries in faraway places. While those people are certainly vital in discipleship efforts, you too are called and sent to make disciples of all nations. Let me share with you a few examples I have recently experienced in my own life.

As I write this to you, I'm on a bus with my son's 8th grade class to visit our nation's capital. Visiting Washington D.C. is a remarkable way to develop a perspective of just how vast our world truly is. A group from a Lutheran school in Fort Wayne, Indiana, venturing to the capital of the most powerful superpower in the world. As we were about to depart for our trip at 5:30 a.m. this morning (yikes!) I prayed with the students and parents in attendance, "Risen Lord and Savior, as we go on this journey, may we show your love with every person we come in contact with." Just as the Holy Spirit is working in the hearts of these precious young people to grow their faith to do good works on behalf of His kingdom, He is doing the same in you.

Last week I was in Wisconsin and stayed at the home of Tim and Paula Huebschman who are wonderful people and faithful servants of the Lord. Important to note that Tim's father, Dr. Ray Huebschman, was instrumental in resurrecting this very ministry back in 1980 when it was known as Worship for Shut-Ins.

God is also doing a good work in this ministry of Worship Anew.

We receive letters every day from viewers around the country who have been blessed by this ministry, one person recently shared the following:

"Dear friends of Jesus, I'm sending this letter to all the wonderful people who work for Worship Anew. As we continued walking, I overheard the son say to his mom that they should go to church again and asked how much it cost. The mom responded that it doesn't cost anything to go to church.

The boy sounded surprised, "It doesn't cost anything!?" As Christians, we know that when it comes to the cost, Jesus paid the price. In fact, through church, WE receive His many gifts. Everything we give is in response to what God has done for us. While I was surprised by that young boy's question to his mom, I was almost moved to tears by his comment of returning to church. Do you know someone like that family who you could share the free gift of God's love for them?

Paula Huebschman encouraged the students she was teaching that morning to spend time reading their Bible for 21 straight days. I think the saying goes that it takes 21 days to create a habit and 90 days to make it permanent. This is a good challenge for all of us. You can start with the Gospels, the Psalms, or the book of Genesis. As you spend time in God's Word may you be inspired to know that we have the incredible opportunity to make disciples in our local community, nationwide, and throughout the world. Whether it's those disciples 2,000 years ago, a group of teenagers from Fort Wayne, Indiana, a person with an amputation in Wisconsin, or a global ministry like Worship Anew, everyone has the opportunity to make disciples of all nations.

# Growing

Last summer I had a suspicious weed in my landscaping. Normally I am merciless when it comes to weeds. This time, I decided to let it grow. Without any help or encouragement from me, it turned into a beautiful sunflower.

This flower became a reminder to me of several things.

First: We need to give ourselves and others time to grow.

I had no idea this 'weed' was really a sunflower. I would have pulled it, fully convinced I was doing the right thing for the rest of my landscaping.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus tells a parable about a man who sowed good seed in his field. In the night, his enemy came and sowed tares (weeds) among the good seeds. As the two started to grow, the man's servants asked if he wanted them to remove the tares. The man told them "No!" He did not want to risk uprooting the wheat in the process. As it turns out, it is difficult to distinguish tares and wheat when they are first growing.

#### Second: It is God who gives the growth.

As a child I planted countless apple seeds in my backyard. I was convinced that with enough love and water, I could start my own orchard. Despite my best efforts, it never worked. I was not able to grow a single tree.

Perhaps that is why I am often overwhelmed by the sowing and reaping language in the Bible. I can plant and water and fertilize, but things don't always grow. Sometimes I don't plant or water at all, and things like this flower still grow.

CARE MINISTRY

Fortunately, things do not depend on me. Paul writes about this in 1 Corinthians: I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. (3:6-7).

Paul goes on to say in verse 9 that "we are God's fellow workers."

We are called to be faithful in our labor, but the outcome does not depend on us. Even if I had planted that sunflower seed and watered it faithfully, I could not make it grow. God gives the growth!

Finally: The harvest may look different than we expect.

The seed had come from a nearby bird feeder. Considering how many seeds fell from that same feeder, dozens of flowers should have been growing! But there was only one.

One is very different than the image I have in my brain when I consider Jesus' words in Matthew 9:27: "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

But Jesus makes it clear in his other parables that sometimes the harvest consists of one – one lost coin, one lost sheep.

### **Prayer**

Lord, You have called Your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go but only that Your hand is leading us and Your love supporting us.
