The History of the Stained Glass at Worship Anew



After the closure of Trinity Lutheran Church in Evansville, Ind., the congregation sought out Worship Anew to house their stained glass windows.

In order for the windows to be moved, they had to be extracted from the church, taken apart piece by piece, cleaned, repaired, and then put back together for the installation. Through the work of stained glass restoration artist, Jules Mominee out of Evansville, as well as the team at Window Creations out of Ottoville, Ohio, four

of the original Trinity stained glass windows were restored and brought to Fort Wayne.

These 180-year-old windows now provide a stunning backdrop for choirs on Worship Anew as well as greeting visitors they enter the atrium.





Above, this window beautifully captures Jesus preaching at the Sea of Galilee, a central location for much of His earthly ministry.

At left, this window depicts one of God's angels, like those who comforted Christ in the garden and later delivered the joyous news of His resurrection.

At right, this window portrays Martin Luther holding his 95 Theses, symbolizing his courageous stand for the true interpretation of God's Word and pointing people to scripture as the ultimate source of wisdom, comfort, and hope. The German at the bottom is from the hymn, "A Mighty Fortress," as explained at right.
